
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## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report provides a snapshot of crime statistics pertaining to the incidents reported to York Regional Police in 2019. Crime rates are calculated for York Region, Districts and Municipalities using the corresponding population estimates<sup>1</sup> received from the Regional Municipality of York.

The **911 Communications Centre** received 663,276 calls in 2019 of which 40.5% were emergency 9-1-1 calls and 59.5% were non-emergency calls. Call response time decreased in 2019 for priority 1 (emergency) calls, priority 2 calls and priority 3 calls compared to 2018 by 2.4%, 1.2% and 0.8% respectively. The response times for priority 1, priority 2 and priority 3 calls decreased to 6:50 minutes, 14:10 minutes and 25:39 minutes respectively in 2019.

275,292 **Citizen Generated Calls for Service** were received in 2019 compared to 241,260 calls in 2018, a 14.1% increase over the year. Of these calls, 109,850 (39.9%) were dispatched, 13,970 calls (5.1%) were diverted to the Community Resource Centre & Alternate Response Unit, and 13,413 calls (4.9%) were diverted to online reporting.

40,913 **Criminal & Federal** violations were reported in 2019, an increase of 2,074 violations or 5.3% from 2018. The crime rate per 100,000 population increased to 3,402.23 or by 4.8% in 2019 from 3,245.89 in 2018. The rate increased for Crimes Against Persons (5.4%), Crimes Against Property (10.0%), Other Criminal Code (3.2%) and Traffic violations (3.0%). The rate decreased for Weapons violations (4.4%), Other Federal violations (14.3%) and Drug violations (48.7%).

8,837 **Crimes Against Persons** (violent crime) violations were reported in 2019 compared to 8,346 violations in 2018, an increase of 491 violations or 5.9%. The crime rate per 100,000 population increased to 734.86 in 2019 from 697.50 in 2018 or by 5.4%. The Crimes Against Persons rate increased for Violations Causing Death (27.09%), Attempt Capital Crime (170.9%), Sexual violations (17.6%), Assault (1.8%), Violations Deprivation Freedom (17.1%) and Robbery & Other Violent violations (6.5%). The rate decreased for Commodification of Sexual Activity (12.1%).

**Robbery** violations reported in York Region increased to 366 violations in 2019 from 349 violations in 2018 or by 4.9%. The breakdown of 2019 robberies included Street robberies (54.9%), followed by Retail Robberies (17.2%), Home Invasion (6.6%), Financial Robberies (4.1%) and Carjacking (3.6%).

1,023 **Drug** violations were reported in 2019 compared to 1,985 violations in 2018, a decrease of 962 violations or 48.5%. The crime rate per 100,000 population decreased to 85.07 in 2019 from 165.89 in 2018, or by 48.7%. Of the Drug violations categories, the rate increased for Trafficking (15.5%) and Production (62.3%) but decreased for Possession (67.6%).

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<sup>1</sup> The Regional Municipality of York (York Region) revised the population estimates of 2016 and 2017 lower based on the 2016 Census results released by Statistics Canada in July 2018. However, the 2016-2017 crime rates in this annual statistical report are not revised according to YRP policy.

5,701 **Intimate Domestic Related** occurrences (criminal and non-criminal) were reported in 2019 compared to 5,729 occurrences in 2018, a decrease of 28 occurrences or 0.5% over a year. Of those intimate domestic occurrences, criminal charges laid for 1,688 or 29.6%.

Reported **Hate Crime** occurrences in York Region increased to 133 incidents or by 8.1% in 2018 from 123 incidents in 2018. The principle motivation factors for reported hate crime were religion (42.9%), race/ethnicity (42.1%) and sexual orientation (12.8%). When race/ethnicity was the principle motivation factor, the Black (55.4%), East & Southeast Asian (14.3%), South Asian (8.9%), Multiple Races/Ethnicities (8.9%), Arab/West Asian (7.1%) and White (5.4%) communities were the most frequent victims. When religion was the principle motivation factor, the Jewish (70.2%), Muslim (19.3%) and other religion (10.5%) communities were the most frequent victims.

25,423 **Crimes Against Property** (property crime) violations were reported in 2019 compared to 22,998 violations in 2018, an increase of 2,425 violations or 10.5%. The crime rate per 100,000 population increased to 2,114.12 in 2019 from 1,922.01 in 2018 or by 10.0%. Of the Crimes Against Property categories, the rate increased for Theft Over \$5,000 (30.5%), Theft Under \$5,000 (10.0%), Have Stolen Goods (10.1%) and Fraud (22.5%). The rate decreased for Arson (12.2%), Break and Enter (5.2%), and Mischief (2.6%).

The number of **Stolen Vehicles** in the York Region increased to 1,384 in 2019 or by 40.5% from 985 in 2018 and the rate per 100,000 population is increased by 39.8%. Honda (95), Toyota (45), Mercedes (40), BMW (29), Volkswagen (26) and Chevrolet (25) were the top five stolen automobiles and Lexus (179), Toyota (127), Honda (77), Ford (70) and Dodge (53) were the top five stolen trucks.

5,388 **Other Criminal Code (including Weapons and Public Morals)** violations were reported in 2019 compared to 5,229 violations in 2018, an increase of 159 or 3.0% over the year. The rate per 100,000 population increased to 448.05 in 2019 from 437.00 in 2018, an increase of 2.5%.

4,964 **Criminal Traffic** violations were reported in 2019, an increase of 168 violations or 3.5% from 2018 and the rate per 100,000 population increased by 3.0%. Of the Traffic violations categories, the rate increased for Impaired Operation (4.4%), Fail to Remain (3.1%) and Drive While Prohibited (21.4%) but decreased for Dangerous Operation (5.5%).

13,085 **Motor Vehicle Collision** reports were processed in 2019, a decrease of 859 reports or 6.2% from 2018. The rate per 100,000 population decreased by 6.6%. There were 27 Fatal Collisions in 2019 where 29 persons were killed including 14 drivers, 10 passengers, 4 pedestrians and 1 cyclist. Major contributing factor for fatal collisions are carelessness (40.7%), speed (18.5%), inattentive (14.8%) and alcohol (11.1%).

Of the **Provincial Traffic** violations, the rate per 100,000 population increased for Disobeying Stop Sign (to 1,132.27 from 1,083.86 or 4.5%), Drive Under Suspension (to 227.60 from 171.49 or 32.7%), Careless Driving (to 450.05 from 434.41 or 3.6%) and Fail to Remain (to 10.15 from 7.27 or 39.5%). However, the rate decreased for Speeding (to 2,899.96 from 3,387.30 or 14.4), Red Light infractions (to 148.35 from 178.43 or 16.9%), Seatbelt Related violations (to 102.95 from 116.84 or 11.9%).

The **Youth Crime** rate per 1,000 population decreased in 2019 to 19.46 or by 4.7% from 20.41 in 2018. The number of young persons involved in violent crimes increased to 796 in 2019 from 777 in 2018, and for property crimes the number increased to 832 in 2019 from 796 in 2018 or 4.5%.

The **Clearance Rate**<sup>2</sup> for Total Criminal and Federal violations (excluding Traffic) decreased to 50.5% in 2019 from 54.2% in 2018. The clearance rate varies by crime types. The rate increased in 2019 for Weapons Violations (to 82.3% from 80.5%), Drug violations (to 97.0% from 96.8%), Other Federal Violations (to 104.1% from 93.2%) and Traffic Violations (to 42.6% from 42.1%), but decreased for Crimes Against Persons (to 64.7% from 72.2%), Crimes Against Property (to 35.7% from 36.1%) and Other Criminal Code (to 86.3% from 87.3%).

### Non-Criminal Statistics

2,257 **Mentally Ill Persons'** reports were submitted in 2019, an increase of 311 reports or 16.0% from 2018. In the last five years, Mentally Ill Persons reports increased 707 or 45.6%.

2,826 **Mentally Ill Apprehensions** reports were submitted in 2019 compared to 2,583 in 2018, an increase of 243 reports or 9.4%. In the last five years, Mentally Ill Apprehensions increased 926 or 48.7%.

176 **Suicide Attempts** reports were submitted in 2019, a decrease of 129 reports or 42.3% from 2018. In the last five years, Suicide Attempts decreased 62 or 26.1%.

788 **Non-Criminal Deaths** reports were submitted in 2019, an increase of 1 report or 0.1% from 2018. In the last five years, Non-Criminal Deaths increased 107 or 15.7%. Non-criminal deaths include natural deaths and non-natural deaths such as suicidal deaths, non-traffic accidental deaths and deaths-undetermined<sup>3</sup>.

566 **Missing Adults** reports were received in 2019, a decrease of 34 reports or 5.7% from 2018. In the last five years, Missing Adult reports increased 37 or 7.0%.

300 **Missing Young Persons** reports were received in 2019, a decrease of 4 reports or 1.3% from 2018. In the last five years, Missing Youth reports decreased 112 or 27.2%.

<sup>2</sup> In early 2018, the Canadian Centre for Justice and Community Safety Statistics changed the definition of 'unfounded' and 'founded' incidents and introduced two categories of 'founded not cleared' incidents Y-insufficient evidence to proceed and Z-victim/complainant declines to proceed (no CSC identified).

### Miscellaneous Statistics

**Police Clearance** letters processed by the Information Management Bureau decreased to 31,717 letters or by 4.3% in 2019 from 33,151 letters in 2018. Volunteer screenings decreased to 21,814 in 2019 or by 54.5% from 47,915 in 2018. The number of Warrants processed increased to 2,000 in 2019 or by 10.2% from 1,815 in 2018 and the number of MVC/Incident Summary Reports decreased to 2,449 in 2019 or by 14.6% from 2,869 reports in 2018.

**Police Clearance Letters** and the Volunteer Screening categories are lower due to new legislation, the Police Record Check Reform Act (PRCRA), which prohibits checks being done on persons under the age of 18 unless it's for a government agency. Also, several licensing agencies changed their requirements, which in turn only allows applicants to attend their local police facility. The fee increase may be reason for declined MVC/Incident summary reports.

The number of **Freedom of Information** requests received by the Legal Services Bureau increased to 3,271 in 2019 or by 1.7% from 3,215 in 2018. The volume of formal requests increased to 1,746 in 2019 from 1,594 in 2018 or by 9.5% while the volume of informal requests decreased to 1,525 in 2019 from 1,621 in 2018 or by 5.9%.

The volume of **Alarm Calls** received in York Region decreased to 10,718 calls in 2019 or by 2.2% from 10,958 in 2018. The volume of false alarm calls decreased by 0.1% to 9,079 calls in 2019 from 9,084 calls in 2018. The proportion of false alarm calls increased to 85.0% in 2019 from 83.0% in 2018.

The number of tips received by **Crime Stoppers** increased to 4,682 or by 9.5% in 2019 from 4,274 tips in 2018. Because of the tips, 83 people were arrested in 2019, which is 25.2% less from the number of arrests made in 2018. The value of property recovered increased to \$6,420,995 or by 3135.2% in 2019 from \$198,470 in 2018. The value of drugs seized decreased to \$237,039 or by 97.6% in 2019 from \$10,051,845 in 2018. The number of weapons seized increased to 12 or by 50.0% in 2019 from 8 weapons in 2018 and rewards authorized decreased to \$16,593 or by 39.8% in 2019 from \$27,575 in 2018.

The **Victim Services of York Region** program served 8,574 clients in 2019 compared to 10,801 clients in 2018, a decrease of 2,227 clients or 20.6%. The breakdown of 2019 clients included 55.2% women, 19.6% men and 25.2% children (0-17 years). The program received 12,651 telephone crisis calls/office visits in 2019 compared to 15,799 calls/visits in 2018, a decrease of 19.9%.



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## INTRODUCTION

This report documents aggregate level crime statistics pertaining to the incidents reported to York Regional Police between January 01 and December 31, 2019. The report is structured into three sections: statistics for York Region, statistics for the Districts and statistics for the Municipalities. Results of the current reporting year (2019) are compared with the previous year (2018) for all the data tables prepared for the York Region, Districts and Municipalities. Trends in the last five years (2015-2019) are provided for key indicators of regional data. A glossary of terms, types of violations and changes in Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) survey methodology during last five year period are included in the appendices.

## METHODOLOGY

The Canadian Centre for Justice and Community Safety Statistics (CCJCSS) of Statistics Canada, in conjunction with police jurisdictions across Canada, collects *Criminal Code* violations data through the incident based Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) survey methodology. The UCR survey was established in 1962 with cooperation and assistance to Canadian Association of Chiefs of Police (CACP). The UCR survey was designed to measure criminal incidents that have been reported to federal, provincial/territorial and municipal police services in Canada.

UCR survey methodology classifies incidents according to the four most serious violations in the incident (generally the violations that carry the longest maximum sentences under the *Criminal Code*). Violent incidents are classified differently from other types of crime. For violent crime, a separate incident is recorded for each victim. In categorizing incidents, violent violations always take precedence over non-violent violations.

York Regional Police implements UCR survey methodology and captures data in the process of receiving incident reports, providing investigative services and resolving the incidents, where possible. York Regional Police publishes crime statistics based on the number of reported violations using the UCR survey methodology. Crime counts presented in this report are based on all violations in a criminal incident.

The Regional Municipality of York Long Range Planning Department has provided 2019 population estimates of York Region, Districts and Municipalities. The estimates are based on the results of Census 2016 counts<sup>4</sup> and Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC) housing completion data in York Region. Crime rates are calculated based on the year-end population estimates received from the Regional Municipality of York.

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<sup>4</sup> The Regional Municipality of York adjusts population estimates when Statistics Canada releases census results including undercounts. The Regional Municipality of York adjusted its population estimates of 2016-2018 lower based on the Census 2016 results published in 2018 by Statistics Canada.



The report includes statistics for the Alarm Program, Crime Stoppers, Legal Services, Victim Services of York Region and other services (police clearance letters, volunteer screening, MVC/Incident summary reports, warrants processed etc.) provided by the Information Management Bureau. Also, the report includes information for selected non-criminal statistics such as mentally ill persons, mental health apprehensions, suicide attempt, non-criminal deaths and missing persons.

Crime rates incorporated in this report were estimated for all categories irrespective of the size of the denominator. Generally, rates and ratios are not reliable if it is based on a small number (less than 30). Readers are requested to consider the fact of ‘small number’ while using crime rate data presented in this report.

For a reported incident, York Regional Police provides investigative resources towards resolving an incident. For some crime types, the process may take years as new investigative information is updated in the records management system. All data in this report is based on reported crime and represents a “snapshot” at the time of extraction from the records management system at year-end. Unless otherwise noted, any updates or revisions to data for the years prior to 2019 are not reflected in this report.

## MAKING COMPARISONS

Unless otherwise noted, all crime statistics in this report are compiled using the “all violations” methodology. The statistics presented in this report should not be compared with those provided by the *Canadian Centre for Justice and Community Safety Statistics (CCJCSS)*, a division of *Statistics Canada*. The CCJCSS published data measures only the most serious offence related to an incident. In addition, the CCJCSS includes the number of offences reported by the Toronto North Detachment of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) with York Regional Police’s crime statistics.

However, the CCJCSS data should be used for comparisons between policing jurisdictions, municipalities and provinces as all data are compiled using the same reporting methodology and those includes incidents reported to municipal, provincial and federal policing organizations.









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## APPENDIX A: GLOSSARY OF TERMS

**Actual** totals include only those incidents for which an occurrence report was made and have been substantiated through police investigation.

**ATM Robberies** include robberies at ATM machines within financial institutions or at stand-alone locations where the victim is approached and forced to withdraw money or is robbed as they are leaving the machine.

**Calls to 9-1-1 Communications Centre** include all telephone calls, 911 and non-emergency, made by members of the public.

**Car Jacking** includes robberies where the intent is to steal a motor vehicle with the use or threat of violence against the person(s) in care or control of that vehicle.

**Charged/Suspect-Chargeable (CSC)** is a person who has been identified as an accused in an incident and against whom a charge may be laid in connection with the incident.

**Citizen Generated Calls for Service** occur when a citizen requests or requires a police response of any kind. Requests are received by, but not limited to, 911 telephone calls, non-emergency telephone calls, walk-in requests, online reports, or requests via other agencies.

**Clearance Rates** are calculated by the number of violations cleared by charge or otherwise (persons processed by other means) divided by the number of violations. These violations may not necessarily have occurred during the reporting period but sometime prior.

**Complainant** is the target of a non-violent incident. The complainant can be person or a company depending on the type of crime.

**Crime Rates** are expressed as a rate per 100,000 population using year-end population estimates supplied by the York Region Long Range Planning Department and have been rounded to two decimal points. The rate for youth crime is based on 1,000 youth population.

**Deposit Robberies** include robberies where a business deposit is stolen from a person using force.

**Dispatched Calls** are those 911 emergency telephone calls and non-emergency telephone calls, which are received at the communications bureau, assessed and then dispatched to front-line officers to assist victim(s) or address concerns.

**Fatal Motor Vehicle Collisions Contributing Factors** are based on the Major Collision Investigation Unit's interpretation of each collision. Distracted driving is counted if there is some physical or witnessed evidence to suggest the collision was linked to distraction. Inattentive is based on witness or physical evidence that would cause belief that the responsible driver was inattentive and there is no other explanation for the collision. All other categories are self-explanatory.

**Financial Robberies** include robberies occurring at banks, credit unions, or involving armoured cars.



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## APPENDIX A: GLOSSARY OF TERMS (CONT'D...)

**Hate Crime** means a criminal offence committed against a person or property, which is motivated by the offender's bias, prejudice, or hate based on race, national or ethnic origin, language, colour, religion, sex, age, mental or physical disability, sexual orientation, or any other similar factor.

**Home Invasion** is an intrusion into a residence with the intent of robbing the occupants therein.

**Incident** or criminal incident is the set of connected events usually constitute in a police occurrence report. An incident may involve several victims, several CSCs, and multiple violations of the law. An incident report in RMS can contain up to four different violations.

**Non-Criminal Deaths** include natural deaths, suicidal deaths, non-traffic accidental deaths and undetermined deaths. The last three categories constitute non-natural deaths.

**Offence** is defined as a statistical fact for aggregate-based reporting. This terminology is not used in incident-based reporting.

**Other Robberies** include robberies that do not meet the criteria for any of the other categories. Examples include hotel robberies, robberies by uninvited guests at house parties, and break and enter occurrences that result in a robbery occurring.

**Retail Robberies** include robberies occurring at retail or commercial premises including convenience stores, restaurants/fast food establishments, massage parlours, gas stations, and donut/coffee shops.

**Street Robberies** include muggings, intimidation style robberies, and all other robberies by force or threat of force that occurs in a public place.

**Unfounded** incidents are those where it has been determined through police investigation that the offence reported did not occur, nor it was attempted. This new definition of unfounded was introduced in January, 2018. The prior definition of unfounded was 'an incident is unfounded if it has been determined through police investigation that no violations of law took place at that time or location'.

**Founded** incident is if, after police investigation it has been determined that the reported offence did occur or was attempted or there is no credible evidence to confirm that the reported incident did not take place. This includes third party reports that fit these criteria.

**Violation** refers to a contravention of the *Criminal Code*, *Federal*, or *Provincial Statutes*.

**Victim** is a person who is the target of a violent or aggressive action or threat.

**Young Person or Youth** refers to a person aged 12 - 17 years inclusive (*Youth Criminal Justice Act*).

**Youth Crime Rate** refers to the number of youths formally charged plus processed by other means for committing a criminal or federal offence per 1,000 youth population. Youth population (12-17 inclusive) estimates used are supplied by the York Region Long Range Planning Department.



## APPENDIX B: TYPE OF VIOLATIONS

**Crimes Against Persons** are crimes involving aggressive action (with the intent to do harm) or threat of such action by one person against another. These include violations causing death, attempt capital crime, sexual violations, commodification of sexual activity, assault, robbery and other violent violations, and violations/deprivation of freedom.

**Violations Causing Death** include murder 1<sup>st</sup> degree, murder 2<sup>nd</sup> degree, manslaughter, infanticide, criminal negligence cause death, and other related offences causing death.

**Attempt Capital Crime** violations include attempted murder and conspiracy to commit murder.

**Sexual** violations include aggravated sexual assault, sexual assault with a weapon or cause bodily harm, and level 1 sexual assault. This category also includes sexual violations that specifically apply to children such as invitation to sexual touching, sexual exploitation, incest, corrupting morals of a child, making sexual explicit materials available to children, voyeurism, bestiality, luring child via computer, anal intercourse, householder permit sexual activity, and distribution of intimate images.

**Commodification of Sexual Activity** violations include obtaining sexual services, material benefit from sexual services, procuring and advertising sexual services.

**Assault** violations include aggravated assault, assault with a weapon or cause bodily harm, level 1 assault, unlawfully cause bodily harm, discharge firearm with intent, assault peace/public officer, criminal negligence cause bodily harm, use firearm/imitation in commission of offence and point firearm.

**Robbery and Other Violent** violations include robbery, extortion, criminal harassment, uttering threats, explosives causing death/bodily harm, arson disregard for human life, intimidation of a justice system participant, intimidation of a non-justice system participant, indecent/harassing communications, forging/destruction of documents associated with Medical Assistance in Dying (MAID) and failure to comply with safeguards (MAID).

**Violations/Deprivation of Freedom** include kidnapping, forcible confinement, hostage taking, trafficking in persons, removing child from Canada, and abduction.

**Crimes Against Property** involve unlawful acts with respect to property but do not involve the use or threat of violence against an individual. These include arson, break and enter, theft, possession/trafficking of stolen goods, fraud, and mischief.

**Drug** violations include violations under the *Controlled Drugs and Substances Act* and the *Food and Drug Act*. These violations are comprised of possession, trafficking, and importation/exportation or production of various illicit controlled drugs and substances.

**Weapons** violations include violations under the *Criminal Code*, which involve any thing used, designed to be used or intended for use in causing death or injury to any person or used for the purpose of threatening or intimidating any person. These include possession, use, trafficking, pointing, unauthorized import/export, firearms documentation and administration, and unsafe storage.



## APPENDIX B: TYPE OF VIOLATIONS (CONT'D...)

**Prostitution/Public Morals** violations include prostitution/public morals and gaming and betting. The definition of public morals violation was revised in 2016.

**Other Criminal Code** violations include the remaining non-traffic *Criminal Code* violations that are classified as neither violent nor property violations. These violations are divided into two parts:

Part A: include bail violations, counterfeiting currency, disturb the peace, escape custody, indecent Act, child pornography, public morals, obstruct peace/public officer, prisoner unlawfully at large, trespass at night, fail to appear, breach of probation, utter threats to property-animal, advocating genocides, and public incitement of hatred.

Part B: include unauthorized recording of movie, offences against public order, offences relating to terrorist activity, offences against administration of law and justice, invasion of privacy, offences against the person and reputation, offences against the rights or property, fraudulent transactions/contracts and trade, intimidation of justice system participant, willful/forbidden acts/respect of certain property, offences related to currency, proceeds of crime, attempts/conspiracies/accessories, offences relating to criminal organization, and all other criminal code.

**Federal Statutes** violations include violations under all other federal statutes. They include the *Bankruptcy Act, Income Tax Act, Canada Shipping Act, Canada Health Act, Customs Act, Competition Act, Excise Act, Immigration/Refugee Protection Act, Firearms Act, National Defense Act, Young Offenders Act, Youth Criminal Justice Act, and Other Federal Statutes*.

**Traffic** violations include all traffic violations under the *Criminal Code*. These include dangerous operation, evade police, impaired related violations (alcohol and drug), street racing, and other criminal traffic violations including fail to stop or remain and drive while prohibited.

**Hate Crime** means a criminal offence committed against a person or property, which is motivated by the offender's bias, prejudice, or hate based on race, national or ethnic origin, language, colour, religion, sex, age, mental or physical disability, sexual orientation, or any other similar factor.

**Homicide** includes first and second degree murders, manslaughter and infanticide. Deaths caused by criminal negligence, suicide and accidental or justifiable homicide are not included in this classification.

**Cybercrime** is defined as a criminal offence involving computer or such device as the object of the crime or the tool used to commit a material component of the offence. Texting, messages on Facebook, Twitter and other such social media are considered as cyber-crime activity if a criminal offence is involved.

**Organized Crime** is a criminal offence committed by members of a criminal organization or street gang for material benefits or financial gains or in order to obtain power and recognition and/or control specific areas of criminal activities.



## APPENDIX C: CHANGES IN REPORTING UCR SURVEY METHODOLOGY (2015-2019)

Changes are made to UCR survey methodology by the Canadian Centre for Justice and Community Safety Statistics (CCJCSS) of Statistics Canada. There are two types of changes that affect UCR survey: changes brought in by the Government of Canada in the form of a new bill or law, and changes that are initiated by the CCJCSS, most often because of feedback or requests from police services or recommendation from the Canadian Association of Chiefs of Police (CACP). This section also include policy and operational changes made by York Regional Police that might affect crime statistics presented for the municipalities, Districts or for the Region. The following sections outlines what changes are made to the UCR survey methodology during last five years period, 2015-2019.

In 2015, York Regional Police modified the default priorities for some call types. This change in methodology could affect call response time comparisons for 2015 compared to previous years.

In April 2015, Bill C-10 *Tackling Contraband Tobacco Act* created the offence of selling, etc. of tobacco products and raw leaf tobacco, previously an offence under the Excise Act. Incidents of this offence will now be included under the Other Criminal Code Part B category.

In March 2015, Bill C-13 *Protecting Canadians from Online Crime Act* created a *Criminal Code* offence for the non-consensual distribution of intimate images and a new UCR violence code was introduced. For the purposes of this report, this offence is included in the Sexual Violations category.

In June 2015, Bill C-51 *Anti-terrorism Act, 2015* was granted royal assent resulting in the addition of a new UCR Violation Code for advocating or promoting commission of terrorism offences. For the purposes of this report, this offence is included in Other Criminal Code Part B category.

In June 2015, Bill C-26 *Tougher Penalties for Child Predators Act (2015)* granted royal assent that came into force on July 2015. With this legislation enacted, the amendments resulted in an increase in maximum penalties for certain sexual offences against children, and violations of prohibition orders and probation orders. Some new offences were introduced and for some existing offences maximum penalties were increased. The changes were implemented during 2016.

In 2016, changes were made to UCR methodology in relation to Bill C-36 *the Protection of Communities and Exploited Persons Act*, which granted royal assent in December 2014. The legislation has resulted updates on a) sexual offences against children, b) commodification of sexual activity, c) Offences in relation to offering, providing or obtaining sexual services for consideration and d) disorderly houses, gaming and betting offences. New violations classified as 'commodification of sexual activity' under Crimes Against Persons include purchasing sexual services, receiving material benefit from the purchase of sexual services and advertising sexual services. The changes were implemented in May 2016.

In May 2016, the Bill C-14 *Medical Assistance in Dying Act, 2016* was granted royal assent resulting in the addition of three new UCR Survey violations codes for failure to comply with safeguards/regulations and forging/destruction of documents. The new offences were incorporated in 2016.



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## APPENDIX C: CHANGES IN REPORTING METHODOLOGY (CONT'D...)

In May 2017, the Bill C-37 *An Act to amend the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act and to make related amendments to other Acts* was granted royal assent resulting in the increased penalty of six drug violations. CCJCSS has adjusted the UCR Survey and the changes were implemented in 2017.

In November 2017, the Canadian Centre for Justice and Community Safety Statistics (CCJCSS) has added four new violation codes specific to opioids (other than heroin) to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) survey. The addition of these codes was in response to the need expressed by police services to capture the prevalence of opioids using violation codes specific to this type of drug. Previously, offences related to the possession, trafficking, importation and exportation and production of opioids (other than heroin) were included under 'other controlled drugs and substances'. The changes were implemented in December 2017.

In December 2017, the Bill C-305 *An Act to amend the Criminal Code (mischief)* was granted royal assent resulting in the changes of the definition of violation code 2176 to 'Hate motivated mischief relating to property used by identifiable group' from 'Mischief to religious property motivated by hate'. The enactment amends Section 430(4.1) of the *Criminal Code*. CCJCSS has made changes to UCR Survey and the changes were implemented in 2018.

In January 2018, the Canadian Centre for Justice and Community Safety Statistics in consultation with the Police Information and Statistics (POLIS) Committee made changes to UCR methodology by introducing new standards for reporting founded and unfounded incidents. The definitions of both unfounded and founded have been updated as:

**Unfounded:** An incident is unfounded if it has been determined through police investigation that the offence reported did not occur, nor it was attempted.

**Founded:** An incident is founded if, after police investigation it has been determined that the reported offence did occur or was attempted or there is no credible evidence to confirm that the reported incident did not take place. This includes third party reports that fit these criteria.

In June 2018, the Canadian Government granted royal assent to Bill C-45: "An Act respecting cannabis and to amend the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act, the *Criminal Code* and other Acts". The come into force date for the legislation was October 17, 2018. In response to the legislation, CCJCSS has introduced 22 new drug offences to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Survey. The existing four cannabis-specific violations were expired. The changes were implemented in 2018.

In June 2018, the Canadian Government granted royal assent to Bill C-46: 'An Act to amend the *Criminal Code* (offences relating to conveyances) and to make consequential amendments to other Acts'. In response to the legislation, CCJCSS has made changes to the UCR methodology in two steps (part). The come into force date for part-1 of the legislation was June 21, 2018 and for part-2 was December 18, 2018. The changes were implemented in December 2018.



## APPENDIX C: CHANGES IN REPORTING METHODOLOGY (CONT'D...)

Part 1 of Bill C-46 amends the provisions of the *Criminal Code* that deal with offences and procedures relating to impaired driving. As a result, 7 new UCR violation codes have been added to the survey. Of those, one violation is to capture operation while impaired with a low blood drug concentration, three violations to capture impaired driving where the substance (whether alcohol or drug) causing impairment is not known, and three violations to capture impaired driving where it is known that the impairment was caused by a combination of alcohol and drugs.

Part 2 of Bill C-46 repeals the provisions of the *Criminal Code* that deal with offences and procedures relating to conveyances, including those provisions enacted by part 1, and replaces them with provisions in a new part of the *Criminal Code*. In response to part 2 of Bill C-46, all existing UCR traffic violation codes have been mapped to new *Criminal Code* sections or expired. Altogether, twelve new violations have been added, fifteen violations (including three provincial offences) have been expired and the maximum penalties were increased for fifteen pre-existing offences.

In December 2014, The Canadian Government granted royal assent to the Bill C-13 '*Protecting Canadians from Online Crime Act*.' The legislation raised the maximum penalty for *Criminal Code* section 372. The came into force date was December 9 2014, but the change was not implemented in the UCR survey by CCJCSS at that time. Effective October 2018, the maximum penalty 'indecent/harassing communications' has been increased from 6 months to 2 years. The changes were implemented by CCJCSS in 2018.

In December 2018, CCJCSS in consultation with the Police Information and Statistics committee, introduced a number of changes to the gender category in the Uniform Crime Reporting Survey. The changes were in response to Bill C-16: An Act to amend the Canadian Human Rights Act and the *Criminal Code* came into force on June 19, 2017. This legislation added gender identity and gender expression to the list of prohibited grounds of discrimination and works to protect any section of the public that is distinguished by gender identity or expression against offences motivated by bias, prejudice, or hate. The changes were implemented in December 2018.

In June 2019, the Canadian Government granted royal assent to Bill C-75, "*An Act to amend the Criminal Code, the Youth Criminal Justice Act and Other Acts to make consequential amendments to other Acts*". As a response to the legislation change CCJCSS has made changes to the UCR survey methodology by expiring two offences and increasing maximum penalties for nine existing offences. York Regional Police Implemented the change in July 2019.

In November 2019, CCJCSS has introduced a new violation 'sexual offence occurring prior to January 04, 1983' to the UCR survey for capturing historical sexual offences. The change was implemented in December 2019.
