Deputy Chief André Crawford receives the BBPA Harry Jerome Social Engagement Award

Deputy Chief André Crawford has been selected as the winner of the **2015 BBPA Harry Jerome Social Engagement Award** which is being presented to him by the Black Business & Professional Association. The Social Engagement Award is presented to an individual who promotes the social environmental or cultural development of the community or one that demonstrated a significant impact with substantial benefits to the community through its application. The Board congratulates Deputy Chief Crawford on receiving this prestigious honour.

Preventing and Investigating Property Crimes

Chief Eric Jolliffe and his team presented **Preventing and Investigating Property Crimes**.

The most common types of property crimes are residential and commercial break and enters, street-level robberies, theft from autos and auto thefts. An effective way to solve and to prevent these crimes is through interaction and consultation with the community. Community engagement allows the police to identify the concerns and spread the message on how to prevent victimization. Some community outreach initiatives include: home safe home, lock it or lose it, graffiti eradication and Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED). Social media is also a useful tool in reaching out to the public and encouraging the community to come together through programs like Community Watch Keswick.

Board Renews Reward for Homicide Investigation

The Board approved a renewal of \$50,000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person(s) responsible for the murder of Yvonne Leroux who was murdered in 1972.

Use of Force Statistics

Whenever an officer uses any type of force, a Use of Force Report must be completed. The Use of Force report is a province-wide standardized method of collecting information by individual police services.

- 165 calls for service resulted in Use of Force reports in 2014
- A total of 254 reports were filed involving 277 officers
- Downward trend in the last few years but an increase since 2013
- Firearms were drawn and pointed 125 times in 2014 compared with 110 times in 2013

- When firearms are discharged it is typically to destroy an animal humanely
- Conducted Energy Weapons were used a total of 21 times in 2014
- 33% of use of force occurred on roadway and mostly between 6pm and 6am.
